ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- o Completion of a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education, or international equivalent
- o Professional resumé or CV
- o Goals statement: 750-1,000 words, describing your academic and career goals related to the intended program
- o Transcripts: Unofficial transcripts for application review, and official documents for any international credentials
- o Two letters of recommendation: Professional or academic in nature
- Content Area Requirements: Students must have certain prerequisite courses to enter a teacher licensure program, visit cehd.gmu.edu/car-advising to learn more
- o International students may have to meet additional requirements, visit go.gmu.edu/GradFAQ for details
