Special Education Cohort
Steps for Applying

Depending on county requirements, there may be **two application procedures** for cohort applicants. Applicants must submit a graduate application to George Mason University. They must also contact their county to determine if there is an application required by the county. If so, the student must complete both the application to George Mason University and the application to the county.

GMU Application Deadlines

- Fall (Students accepted for fall are allowed to register for summer classes): **April 1** priority. For summer, students must be accepted prior to the start of their summer course. For fall, complete applications will be reviewed until **August 15**, provided space is still available. Applications that are incomplete will not be reviewed after this date.

- Spring: **November 1** priority. Complete applications will be reviewed until **January 5**, provided space is still available. Applications that are incomplete will not be reviewed after this date.

- Summer: **February 1** priority. Complete applications will be reviewed until **May 15**, provided space is still available. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed after this date

Once accepted to GMU, students continue to be registered for cohort classes by the special education program office. Students should consult the cohort website (<https://education.gmu.edu/special-education-cohort/>) for details on cohort course registration.

Cohort students are required to submit a **complete graduate** GMU application (**not non-degree**).

APPLY TO GMU (College of Education and Human Development)

STEP 1: Select Your Program and Review Admissions Requirements

Cohort applicants may apply either to a certificate or to a Masters in Special Education. Students who intend to use their certificate coursework as electives toward an MEd should apply to the Masters in Special Education. Instructions for adding the certificate program are included in the program acceptance letters. Students who are unsure of the program to which they should apply should contact the Special Education Advising office (<https://education.gmu.edu/special-education/med#advising>)

Options include:

- MED in Special Education with a
 - concentration in K-12 Adapted Curriculum Licensure- E1-MED- EDSE-KACL
 - concentration in K-12 General Curriculum Licensure-E1-MED-EDSE-KGCL

- Add on Certificate Special Education-General Curriculum-E1-CERG-EDGC

IMPORTANT: When choosing your program in the application, please refer to the above list with program codes and make sure you select the correct one.

Requirements for admission are:

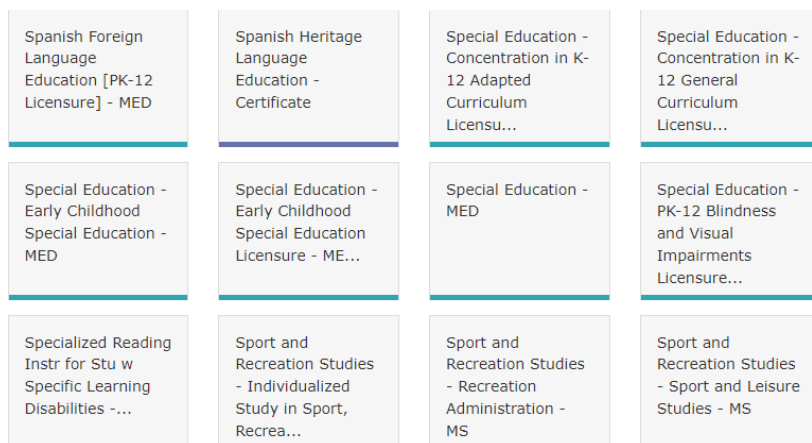
- Complete graduate application to include application fee.
- 750 -1000 word goal statement that addresses the reasons for choosing to become a special education teacher and what you hope to accomplish when you are finished with the program. The goal statement can also be used to explain low undergraduate GPA.
- Resume
- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution with a cumulative GPA of 3.0. Some applicants with a lower GPA may be admitted provisionally if there is sufficient evidence of potential success. Applicants who do not have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 are encouraged to include Praxis Core, SAT, ACT, or VCLA (<http://cehd.gmu.edu/teacher/test/>) test scores with the application.
- Scanned, unofficial copies of your transcripts for application review. Please make sure your documents are legible. They should include your full name, show your school name, and have your degree conferral date, if earned. If admitted, however, all applicants are required to submit official, final transcripts prior to the last day to add/drop courses in their first semester.
- Two recommendation from former or current employers or university professors, targeting work experiences and academic abilities submitted through the online application system. If you are an applicant with **international** credentials:

STEP 2: Apply online

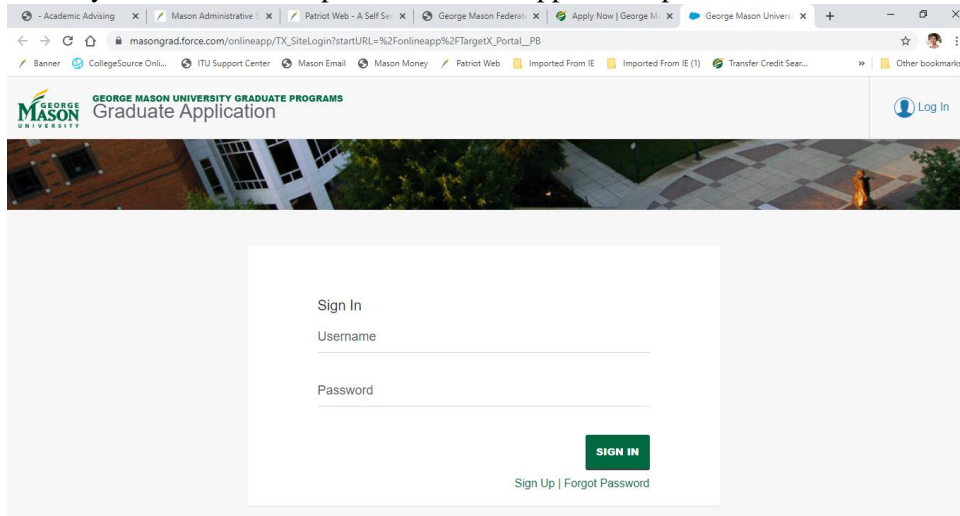

1. Select Find Your Program.
2. Scroll down to “Special Education” to see all the options for our program



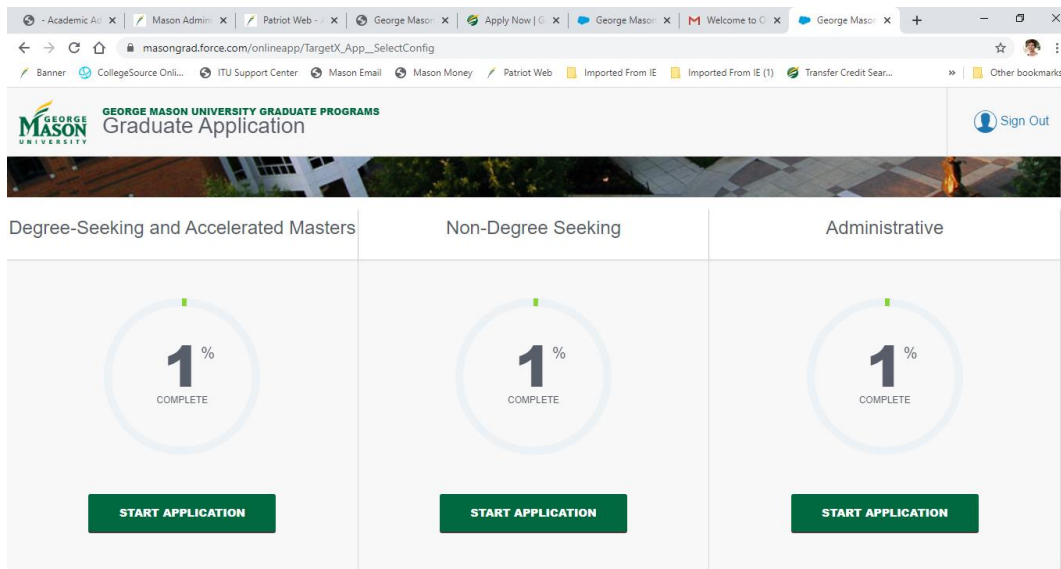
3. Click Apply now on the left side of the screen

4. Create your username and password for the application portal site.



Check your email. Click the link in your application email. Create a Password. **Make a note of the email you are using. This will be your username. Make a note of your password.** You will continue to use it to update and check the status of your application.

5. Start your application. Be sure to select Degree-Seeking.



6. Select the program you would like to apply for. The following example is for the MEd in Special Education program. **Do not** select the program “Advanced Studies in Teaching & Learning – Special Education – MED”. This program does not offer initial teacher licensure. Scroll down to select “Special Education – MED” with the concentration that you are wanting to apply for. If you are applying to a cohort program, be sure to select on-campus or hybrid program and not online.
