EDSE 783 Internship: Two internship experiences are required for licensure Master's programs: one at the elementary level and one at the secondary level. Internship options should be discussed with an advisor upon admission to the program.

Some students may be eligible to waive one internship experience. For more information on the requirements for the waiver and the documentation that a student must submit in order to request the waiver see the checklist on the internship webpage.

Non-course Requirements (<http://cehd.gmu.edu/teacher/test/>):

VCLA and CPR/AED/First Aid training are required prior to applying for internship. Praxis Teaching Reading must be completed prior to graduation from the Master's and/or submitting for VDOE licensure.
